| 8 | (1) | Whether there is a shortage of craftsmen in the State who possess the |
| 9 | | special skills necessary for proper restoration and rehabilitation of |

| 11 | (2) | Which specific trades are lacking in the State and the type of skills that |
| 12 | | are most needed for the preservation and rehabilitation of the State's |
| 13 | | historic sites. |
| 14 | (3) | The types of preservation crafts training methods that have been used |
| 15 | | in other parts of the country and the training programs that are |
| 16 | | currently offered in this State, particularly through the community |
| 17 | | college system and at the John C. Campbell Folk School and Penland |
| 18 | | School of Crafts. |
| 19 | (4) | The economic and cultural benefit to the State in providing |
| 20 | | preservation crafts training. |
| 21 | (5) | Any other issues relevant to determining the need for preservation |
| 22 | | crafts training in this State and the availability of this type of training. |
