A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE METHOD BY WHICH NONCERTIFIED PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES ARE PLACED ON A SALARY SCHEDULE.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  Section 1. G.S. 115C-12(16) reads as rewritten:  "(16) Power with Regard to Salary Schedules. —  a. Support personnel refers to all public school employed who are not required by statute or regulation to be certified in order to be employed. The State Board Education is authorized and empowered to adopt a necessary rules for full implementation of all schedule to the extent that State funds are made available for support personnel.  b. Prior to By the end of the third payroll period of the 1 2 1995-96 sehool fiscal year, local boards of education shall place State-allotted office support personnel, 3 teacher assistants, and custodial personnel on the salary 4 schedule adopted by the State Board of Education so that 5 6 the average salary paid is the State-allotted amount for 7 the category. In placing employees on the salary 8 schedule, the local board shall consider the education, 9 training, and experience of each employee. It is the 10 intent of the General Assembly that a local school administrative unit not fail to employ an employee who 11 12 was employed for the prior school year in order to implement the provisions of this sub-subdivision. 13 14 local board of education is in compliance with this sub-15 subdivision if the average salary paid is at least ninetyfive percent (95%) of the State-allotted amount for the 16 17 category at the end of the third payroll period of the 18 1995-96 fiscal year, and at least ninety-eight percent (98%) of the State-allotted amount for the category at the 19 20 end of the third payroll period of each subsequent fiscal 21 year. The Department of Public Instruction shall provide technical assistance to local school administrative units 22 regarding the implementation of this sub-subdivision. 23 24 The average salary paid to employees in each category from State-allotted funds for the 1993-94 25 school year shall be at least two percent (2%) higher than 26 27 the average salary paid to employees in that category from State-allotted funds for the 1992-93 school year. 28 29 The State Board of Education shall report to the 30 General Assembly, prior to March 31, 1994, and March 31, 1995, and March 31, 1996, on the implementation of 31 32 this sub-subdivision. Salary schedules for other support personnel, including 33 c. but not limited to maintenance and school food service 34 35 personnel, shall be adopted by the State Board of 36 Education. The Board shall classify these support 37 positions in terms of uniform pay grades included in the 38 salary schedule of the State Personnel Commission. 39 These schedules shall apply if the local board of education does not adopt a salary schedule of its own for 40 41 personnel paid from other than State appropriations."

Sec. 2. Beginning with the 1994-95 fiscal year, the State Board of Education shall allot salary funds for State-allotted school custodian positions on the basis of one

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- thousand two hundred nine dollars (\$1,209) a month for each position plus any salary
- 2 increment authorized for school custodians by the General Assembly.
- 3 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1994.
