5	Section 1. G.S. 143-58.1 reads as rewritten:	
6	"§ 143-58.1. Unauthorized use of public purchase or contract procedures for	)r
7	private benefit.	
8	(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, by the use of the powers, policies of	or
9	procedures described in this Article or established hereunder, to purchase, attempt t	to
10	purchase, procure or attempt to procure any property or services for private use of	or
11	benefit.	
12	(b) This prohibition shall not apply if:	
13	(1) The department, institution or agency through which the property of	or
14	services are procured had theretofore established policies an	
15	procedures permitting such purchases or procurement by a class of	
16	classes of persons in order to provide for the mutual benefit of suc	
17	persons and the department, institution or agency involved, or the	ıe
18	public benefit or convenience; and	
19	(2) Such policies and procedures, including any reimbursement policie	
20	are complied with by the person permitted thereunder to use the	
21	purchasing or procurement procedures described in this Article of	or
22	established thereunder.	

## GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NORTH CAROLINA

1	(b1) It is unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to directly or indirectly
2	give, offer, or promise anything of value to any officer or employee of a State
3	department, institution, or agency, who has authority to purchase or procure goods or
4	services or recommend the purchase or procurement of goods and services, or to
5	promise any such officer or employee to give anything of value to any other person with
6	intent:
7	(1) To influence any official act of the officer or employee;
8	(2) To influence the officer or employee to commit or aid in committing,
9	or collude in, or allow, any fraud, or to make opportunity for the
10	commission of any fraud on the State of North Carolina; or
11	(3) To induce the officer or employee to do or omit to do any act in
12	violation of his lawful duty.
13	(b2) It shall be unlawful for any officer or employee of a State department,
14	institution, or agency, who has authority to purchase or procure goods or services or
15	recommend the purchase or procurement of goods and services, directly or indirectly, to
16	ask, demand, exact, solicit, accept, receive, or agree to receive anything of value for
17	himself or any other person or entity in return for:
18	(1) Being influenced in his performance of any official act:
19	(2) <u>Being influenced to commit or aid in committing, or to collude in, or</u>
20	allow, any fraud, or to make opportunity for the commission of any
21	(2) <u>fraud on the State of North Carolina; or</u>
22 23	(3) Being induced to do or omit to do any act in violation of his official

	(c) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor punishable by fine,
25 26	imprisonment up to two years, or both, in the discretion of the court." Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1993, and applies to acts and
