1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT A RECOMMENDATION OF THE EDUCATIONAL
3 LEADERSHIP TASK FORCE AND THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION
4 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TO ESTABLISH A PRINCIPAL FELLOWS
5 PROGRAM TO ENCOURAGE EXCELLENCE IN THE RECRUITMENT OF
6 CANDIDATES FOR EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 Section 1. Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
9 Article to read:

10 **"ARTICLE 5C.**

11 **"NORTH CAROLINA PRINCIPAL FELLOWS PROGRAM.**

12 **"§ 116-74.41. North Carolina Principal Fellows Commission established;**
13 **membership.**

14 (a) There is established the North Carolina Principal Fellows Commission. The
15 Commission shall exercise its powers and duties independently of the Board of
16 Governors of The University of North Carolina. The director of the Principal Fellows
17 Program shall staff the Commission. The State Education Assistance Authority (SEAA)
18 as created in G.S. 116-203 shall be responsible for implementing scholarship loan
19 agreements, monitoring, cancelling through service, collecting and otherwise enforcing
20 the agreements for the Principal Fellows Program scholarship loans established in
21 accordance with G.S. 116-74.42.

22 (b) The Commission shall consist of 12 members appointed as follows:

- 1 (1) One member of the Board of Governors of The University of North
2 Carolina appointed by the chair of that board, notwithstanding G.S.
3 116-7(b).
- 4 (2) One member of the State Board of Education appointed by the State
5 Board chair.
- 6 (3) Two deans of schools of education appointed by the President of The
7 University of North Carolina.
- 8 (4) One public school teacher appointed by the General Assembly upon
9 the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- 10 (5) One public school principal appointed by the General Assembly upon
11 the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 12 (6) A local superintendent chosen by the State Superintendent of Public
13 Instruction.
- 14 (7) One member to represent business and industry appointed by the
15 Governor.
- 16 (8) One local school board member appointed by the chair of the State
17 Board of Education.
- 18 (9) One parent of a public school child appointed by the State
19 Superintendent of Public Instruction.
- 20 (10) The chairperson of the Board of the State Education Assistance
21 Authority.
- 22 (11) The director of the Principal Fellows Program. The director shall chair
23 the Commission.

24 (c) Initial appointments shall be made no later than September 15, 1993. Initial
25 terms of those members appointed to fill the teacher, principal, parent, superintendent,
26 and the local board member seats shall expire July 1, 1995. Initial terms of those
27 members appointed to fill the Board of Governors, State Board of Education, deans of
28 schools of education, and the member of business and industry seats shall expire July 1,
29 1997. Thereafter, all appointments for these seats shall be for four-year terms.

30 (d) Except as otherwise provided, if a vacancy occurs in the membership, the
31 appointing authority shall appoint another person to serve for the balance of the
32 unexpired term. In the discretion of the appointing authority, a State Board of
33 Education member or Board of Governors' member may complete a term on the
34 Commission after the member's appointment from the appointing board has expired.

35 (e) Commission members shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel
36 allowances in accordance with G.S. 138-5 or G.S. 138-6, as appropriate.

37 (f) The Commission shall meet regularly, at times and places deemed necessary
38 by the chair.

39 **"§ 116-74.42. Principal Fellows Program established; administration.**

40 (a) A Principal Fellows Program shall be administered by the North Carolina
41 Principal Fellows Commission in collaboration with the State Education Assistance
42 Authority. The Principal Fellows Program shall provide up to a two-year scholarship
43 loan to selected recipients and shall provide extracurricular enhancement activities for
44 recipients. The North Carolina Principal Fellows Commission shall determine selection

1 criteria, methods of selection, and shall select recipients to receive scholarship loans
2 made under the Principal Fellows Program.

3 (b) The Board of Governors shall appoint a director of the Principal Fellows
4 Program. The director shall chair and staff the Principal Fellows Commission, and
5 shall administer the extracurricular enhancement activities of the program. The Board
6 of Governors shall provide office space and clerical support staff for the program.

7 (c) The Principal Fellows Program shall provide a two-year scholarship loan in
8 the amount of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) per year, per recipient, to persons
9 selected to be school administrators in the public schools of the State by completing a
10 full-time program in school administration in an approved program. Approved
11 programs are those chosen by the Commission from among school administrator
12 programs within the constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina. No
13 more than 200 principal fellow scholarship loan awards shall be made in each year. The
14 final number of scholarship loan awards per year shall be made in accordance with the
15 Board of Governors' findings concerning the supply and demand of administrators, the
16 State's need for school administrator candidates and within funds appropriated for the
17 scholarship loans. Effective September 1, 1995, and in accordance with school
18 administrator training programs established by the Board of Governors of The
19 University of North Carolina, recipients shall be required to complete an approved full-
20 time academic program during the first year of the scholarship loan program and a full-
21 time internship during the second year of the program. In order to attract fellows as
22 interns, local school administrative units may use all or part of the funds allotted for an
23 assistant principal salary for each intern accepted by the local school administrative
24 unit; however, interns shall not serve as assistant principals.

25 (d) The Commission shall adopt stringent standards, which may include
26 standardized test scores, undergraduate performance, job experience and performance,
27 leadership and management abilities, and other standards deemed appropriate by the
28 Commission, to ensure that only the best potential students receive scholarship loans
29 under the Principal Fellows Program. The Commission shall consider the qualifications
30 of all applicants fairly, regardless of gender or race, and shall consider the geographic
31 diversity of the State. Scholarship loans under the Principal Fellows Program shall be
32 awarded only to applicants who meet the standards set by the Commission, are
33 domiciled in North Carolina, and who agree to work as school administrators in a North
34 Carolina public school or at a school operated by the United States government in North
35 Carolina upon completion of the two-year school administrator program supported by
36 the loan.

37 (e) State employees or employees of local school administrative units chosen to
38 receive scholarship loans shall be eligible for coverage under the Teachers' and State
39 Employees' Comprehensive Major Medical Plan.

40 (f) The Commission shall develop and administer the Principal Fellows Program
41 in cooperation with school administrator programs at institutions approved by the
42 Commission. The Commission shall develop criteria and a process for the approval of
43 campus program sites. Extracurricular enhancement activities shall be coordinated with

1 each fellow's campus program and shall focus on the leadership development of
2 program fellows.

3 (g) The Commission may form regional review committees to assist it in
4 identifying the best applicants for the program. The Commission and the review
5 committees shall make an effort to identify and encourage women and minorities and
6 others who may not otherwise consider a career in school administration to apply for the
7 Principal Fellows Program.

8 (h) Upon the naming of recipients of the scholarship loans by the Principal
9 Fellows Commission, the Commission shall transfer to the State Education Assistance
10 Authority (SEAA) its decisions. The SEAA shall perform all of the administrative
11 functions necessary to implement this Article, which functions shall include: rule
12 making, dissemination of information, disbursement, receipt, liaison with participating
13 educational institutions, determination of the acceptability of service repayment
14 agreements, and all other functions necessary for the execution, payment, and
15 enforcement of promissory notes required under this Article.

16 **"§ 116-74.43. Terms of loans; receipt and disbursement of funds.**

17 (a) All scholarship loans shall be evidenced by notes made payable to the State
18 Education Assistance Authority that bear interest at the rate of ten percent (10%) per
19 year beginning 90 days after completion of the school administrator program, or 90 days
20 after termination of the scholarship loan, whichever is earlier. The scholarship loan
21 may be terminated upon the recipient's withdrawal from school or by the recipient's
22 failure to meet the standards set by the Commission.

23 (b) The State Education Assistance Authority shall forgive the loan if, within six
24 years after graduation from a school administrator program, the recipient serves for four
25 years as a school administrator at a North Carolina public school or at a school operated
26 by the United States government in North Carolina. The SEAA shall also forgive the
27 loan if it finds that it is impossible for the recipient to work for four years, within 10
28 years after completion of the two-year school administrative program supported by the
29 scholarship loan at a North Carolina public school or at a school operated by the United
30 States government in North Carolina, because of the death or permanent disability of the
31 recipient. If the recipient repays the scholarship loan by cash payments, all
32 indebtedness shall be repaid within 10 years after completion of the two-year school
33 administrative program supported by the scholarship loan.

34 (c) All funds appropriated to, or otherwise received by, the Principal Fellows
35 Program for scholarships, all funds received as repayment of scholarship loans, and all
36 interest earned on these funds, shall be placed in a university trust fund. This university
37 trust fund may be used only for scholarship loans granted under the Principal Fellows
38 Program and administrative costs associated with the recovery of funds advanced under
39 the program."

40 Sec. 2. The Commission may grant up to 100 scholarship loans during the
41 1994-95 fiscal year to recipients enrolled in school administrator programs approved by
42 the Commission and located within the constituent universities of The University of
43 North Carolina.

1 Sec. 3. Nothing contained in this act shall be construed as obligating the
2 General Assembly to appropriate funds. Sections of this act requiring State funding for
3 implementation shall not become effective until such funds are appropriated.

4 Sec. 4. Nothing in this act shall be construed as obligating the Board of
5 Governors of The University of North Carolina to allocate funds for the program
6 established under this act unless additional appropriations for the program are made by
7 the General Assembly.

8 Sec. 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
