- 2 AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT A RECOMMENDATION OF THE GOVERNMENT 3 PERFORMANCE AUDIT COMMITTEE REGARDING TEACHER
- 4 CERTIFICATION.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
- 6 —-REDUCE TEACHER CERT. WORK.
- 7 Section 1. (a) G.S. 115C-296(a) reads as rewritten:

8 The State Board of Education shall have entire control of certifying all "(a) applicants for teaching positions in all public elementary and high schools of North 9 Carolina; and it shall prescribe the rules and regulations for the renewal and extension 10 of all certificates and shall determine and fix the salary for each grade and type of 11 certificate which it authorizes: Provided, that the authorizes. The rules shall provide that 12 the Department of Public Instruction shall consider for teacher certification only 13 applicants who have jobs or job offers from public or private schools located within 14 North Carolina. The State Board of Education shall require each applicant for an initial 15 certificate or graduate certificate to demonstrate his academic and professional 16 preparation by achieving a prescribed minimum score at least equivalent to that required 17 by the Board on November 30, 1972, on a standard examination appropriate and 18 adequate for that purpose: Provided, further, that in the event the Board shall specify the 19 National Teachers Examination for this purpose, the required minimum score shall not 20 be lower than that which the Board required on November 30, 1972: Provided, further, 21 that the State Board of Education shall not decrease the certification standards for 22

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physical education teachers or health education teachers below the standards in effect on 1 2 June 1, 1988." 3 (b) Because of the reduction in workload resulting from subsection (a) of this section, one Teacher Certification position and one application processing clerk position 4 5 in the Teacher Certification area of the Department of Public Instruction are abolished. 6 (c) The base budget of the Department of Public Instruction is reduced by 7 eighty-six thousand one hundred ninety-seven dollars (\$86,197) for the 1993-94 fiscal 8 year and eighty-six thousand one hundred ninety-seven dollars (\$86,197) for the 1994-9 95 fiscal year due to the decrease in personnel positions mandated by subsection (b) of 10 this section. (d) This section becomes effective July 1, 1993. 11 12 —-MODIFY TEACHER CERTIFICATION. 13 Sec. 2. (a) The Department of Public Instruction shall modify the current 14 teacher certification system to improve information needed for staff management. The 15 teacher certification system shall be modified to produce detailed statistics that indicate 16 why productivity rates of the Teacher Certification group have declined, that enable the 17 Department to improve operational decision-making, and that indicate whether staff

18 reductions in the Teacher Certification group are justified.

19 The Department shall report on the implementation of this section to the Joint 20 Legislative Education Oversight Committee prior to March 31, 1994.

21 (b) This section becomes effective July 1, 1993.
