A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR VARIOUS WATER RESOURCES
DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS AND VARIOUS COASTAL DREDGING
PROJECTS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources the sum of seven million four hundred thousand dollars (\$7,400,000) for the 1993-94 fiscal year to be used for water resources development projects. The Department shall fund the following projects whose estimated costs are as indicated:

34 Sec. 2. Where the actual costs are different from the estimated costs under
 35 Section 1 of this act, the Department may adjust the allocations among projects as
 36 needed. If any projects listed in Section 1 of this act are delayed and the budgeted State
 37 funds cannot be used during the 1993-94 fiscal year, or if the projects listed in Section 1
 38 of this act are accomplished at a lower cost, the Department may use the resulting fund
 39 availability to fund:

- 40 (1) Corps of Engineers project feasibility studies, or
- 41 (2) Corps of Engineers projects whose schedules have advanced and
- 42 require State matching funds in fiscal year 1993-94, or
- 43 (3) State-local Water Resources Development Projects.

1 Funds not expended or encumbered for these purposes shall revert to the General Fund
2 at the end of the 1994-95 fiscal year.

3 Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
4 Environment, Health, and Natural Resources the sum of one million dollars
5 (\$1,000,000) for the 1993-94 fiscal year to fund various coastal dredging projects.

6 Sec. 4. Beginning October 1, 1993, the Department shall make quarterly
7 reports on the use of these funds to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental
8 Operations, the Fiscal Research Division, and the Office of State Budget and
9 Management. Each report shall include:

- 10 (1) All projects listed in this act;
- 11 (2) The estimated cost of each project;
- 12 (3) The date that work on each project began or is expected to begin;
- 13 (4) The date that work on each project was completed or is expected to be
14 completed; and
- 15 (5) The actual cost of each project.

16 The quarterly reports shall also show those projects advanced in schedule, those projects
17 delayed in schedule, and an estimate of the amount of funds expected to revert to the
18 General Fund.

19 Sec. 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
