February 15, 1993 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT A RECOMMENDATION OF THE GOVERNMENT 3 PERFORMANCE AUDIT COMMITTEE DIRECTING THE SECRETARY OF 4 ADMINISTRATION TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT INNOVATIVE GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT PRACTICES. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 143-49 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "(3b) To develop and implement innovative procurement practices so as to reduce the cost of ordering supplies and services, reduce the volume of 9 10 inventory maintained by State departments and agencies, and increase the quality of products purchased. These innovative procurement practices shall include (i) requiring State departments and agencies to 12 order items from prime vendors for delivery at the time the items are 13 needed instead of ordering for stock, when it is advisable to do so, and 14 (ii) urging State departments and agencies to place orders with vendors electronically. 16 The Secretary may appoint a task force to assist him in the 17 implementation of this duty." 18

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
