AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT A RECOMMENDATION OF THE GOVERNMENT

PERFORMANCE AUDIT COMMITTEE TO ESTABLISH A POLICY TO

INCREASE THE USE OF COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAMS FOR THE

DEVELOPMENTALLY DISABLED AND TO DOWNSIZE STATE-OPERATED

MENTAL RETARDATION CENTERS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. The General Assembly finds that North Carolina currently offers residential services for the developmentally disabled population and that residential programs are the most costly and most restrictive methods of caring for this population. The General Assembly further finds that persons with developmental disabilities can be served far more effectively through a broad array of residential and nonresidential services. Therefore, the General Assembly establishes a clear commitment to increase the use of community-based programs to serve the developmentally disabled, and to downsize State-operated mental retardation centers.

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
