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2	AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT A RECOMMENDATION OF THE GOVERNMENT				
3	PERFORMANCE AUDIT COMMITTEE TO REPEAL THE AUTOMATIC				
4	MERIT PAY INCREASE FOR HIGHWAY PATROL OFFICERS AND TO				
5	MAKE MERIT PAY FOR HIGHWAY PATROL OFFICERS SUBJECT TO THE				
6	SAME BUDGETARY AND PERSONNEL EVALUATION PROCESSES AS ARE				
7	APPLICABLE TO OTHER STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.				
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
9	Section 1. The General Assembly finds that:				
10	(1) The special merit pay increase for Highway Patrol officers has created				
11	morale problems among other State law enforcement officers. Morale				
12	problems arise when those other law enforcement officers whose				
13	performance would otherwise merit an increase do not receive				
14	increases when the budget does not provide funding for merit raises.				
15	(2) The special merit pay provision violates the principle that employees				
16	in similar jobs and operating at comparable levels of performance				
17	should be compensated similarly.				
18	Sec. 2. G.S. 20-187.3(a) reads as rewritten:				
19	"(a) The Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety shall not make or permit to				
20	be made any order, rule, or regulation requiring the issuance of any minimum number of				
21	traffic citations, or ticket quotas, by any member or members of the State Highway				
22	Patrol. Pay and promotions of members of the Highway Patrol shall be based on their				
23	overall job performance and not on the basis of the volume of citations issued or arrests				
24	made. The provisions of G.S. 126-7 shall not apply to members of the State Highway Patrol.				

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- Members of the Highway Patrol shall, however, be subject to salary classes, ranges and
  longevity pay for service as are applicable to other State employees generally. Beginning July
- 3 1, 1985, and annually thereafter, each member of the Highway Patrol shall be granted a salary
- 4 increase in an amount corresponding to the increments between steps within the salary range
- 5 established for the class to which the member's position is assigned by the State Personnel
- 6 Commission, not to exceed the maximum of each applicable salary range. Beginning July 1,
- 7 <u>1993, the provisions of G.S. 126-7 shall apply to members of the State Highway Patrol.</u>"

8 Sec. 3. The base budget of the Department of Crime Control and Public

9 Safety is reduced by one million one hundred thirty-seven thousand three hundred 10 eighty-six dollars (\$1,137,386) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and by two million three

- hundred seventy-nine thousand four hundred twelve dollars (\$2,379,412) for the 1994-
- 12 95 fiscal year due to the repeal of the automatic merit pay increase in Section 2 of this
- 13 act.

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Sec. 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
