11	(b2) It shall be unlawful for any officer or employee of a State department,
12	institution, or agency, who has authority to purchase or procure goods or services or
13	recommend the purchase or procurement of goods and services, directly or indirectly, to
14	ask, demand, exact, solicit, accept, receive, or agree to receive anything of value for
15	himself or any other person or entity in return for:
16	(1) Being influenced in his performance of any official act;

- (2) Being influenced to commit or aid in committing, or to collude in, or allow, any fraud, or to make opportunity for the commission of any fraud on the State of North Carolina; or
- (3) Being induced to do or omit to do any act in violation of his official duty.
- (c) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor punishable by fine, imprisonment up to two years, or both, in the discretion of the court."
- Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1993, and applies to acts and omissions occurring after that date.
