2	AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE GIVING OR RECEIPT OF GIFTS OR FAVORS TO
3	GOVERNMENTAL OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES CHARGED WITH
4	PREPARING, AWARDING, ADMINISTERING, OR SUPERVISION OF PUBLIC
5	CONTRACTS.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. The heading of Article 31 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes
8	reads as rewritten:
9	"Misconduct in Public Office and Employment."
10	Sec. 2. Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding the
11	following new section to read:
12	"§ 14-252.1. Gifts and favors to public officers and employees from public
13	contractors prohibited.
14	(a) It shall be unlawful for any contractor, subcontractor, or supplier who:
15	Has a contract with a governmental agency;
16	Has performed under such a contract within the past year; or
17	Anticipates bidding on, negotiating, or entering into such a contract in
18	the future
19	to make gifts or to give favors to any officer or employee of a governmental agency
20	who is charged with the duty of:

1			Preparing plans, specifications, or estimates for public contract;
2			Awarding or administering public contracts; or
3			Inspecting or supervising construction.

19			(\$25.00) in annual aggregate value from any one person;
20		<u>(3)</u>	Meals and entertainment furnished at banquets;
21		<u>(4)</u>	Donations to professional organizations to defray meeting expenses
22			where governmental officers and employees are members of the
23			professional organizations, or the participation of governmental
24			officers and employees who are members of professional organizations
25			in all scheduled meeting functions available to all members of the
26			professional organization attending the meeting;
27		<u>(5)</u>	Customary gifts or favors between governmental officers and
28			employees and their friends and relatives or the friends and relatives of
29			their spouses, minor children, or members of their household where it
30			is clear that it is that relationship rather than the business of the
31			individual concerned which is the motivating factor for the gift or
32			favor. However, all such gifts knowingly made or received are
33			required to be reported by the donee to the agency head if the gifts are
34			made by a contractor, subcontractor, or supplier doing business
35			directly or indirectly with the governmental agency employing the
36			recipient of such a gift.
37	<u>(f)</u>		following definitions apply in this section:
38		<u>(1)</u>	Contractor. – a person entering into a public contract with a
39			governmental agency.
40		<u>(2)</u>	Governmental Agency The State of North Carolina, its agencies,
41			institutions, and political subdivisions, all municipal corporations and
42			all other public units, agencies, and authorities which are authorized to
43			enter into public contracts for construction or repair or for procurement
44			of goods or services.

Public Contract. - An agreement between, or on behalf of, a 4 <u>(4)</u> governmental agency and any person for the procurement of goods, 5 services, or construction or repair." 6 7 Sec. 3. G.S. 133-32 is repealed. Sec. 4. This act becomes effective December 1, 1993, and applies to offenses 8 committed on or after that date. Notwithstanding the repeal of G.S. 133-32 by Section 3 9 of this act, prosecutions for offenses committed under the former Section 133-32 prior 10 to December 1, 1993, shall not be affected. 11
