ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

The Victims Assistance Network currently receives federal funding of \$155,315 which is matched by \$51,772 in private funds. The federal funds are passed through the Governor's Crime Commission.

The proposed bill would provide a direct State appropriation to the Network through Crime Control and Public Safety. It is assumed that the Department and the Crime Commission are not requiring a match to state funds.
