A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE EXPANSION FUNDS TO THE JUDICIAL  
2 DEPARTMENT FOR NECESSARY POSITIONS AND EQUIPMENT  
3 NECESSARY TO EFFECT THE CRIME PREVENTION INITIATIVES OF THE  
4 1994 EXTRA SESSION OF THE 1993 GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND FOR  
5 OTHER PURPOSES.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial  
9 Department the sum of thirteen million eight hundred fifteen thousand five hundred  
10 forty-eight dollars (\$13,815,548) for the 1994-95 fiscal year, for expansion funds for  
11 necessary positions and equipment needed to effect the crime prevention initiatives of  
12 the 1994-95 Extra Session of the 1993 General Assembly and for other purposes. These  
13 funds shall be allocated as follows:

- 14 (1) \$3,663,691 for court implementation of the Structured Sentencing Act;  
15 (2) \$6,120,932 for additional court infrastructure requirements for  
16 equipment and data processing equipment;  
17 (3) \$315,000 for laptop personal computers for those superior court judges  
18 that do not now have them;  
19 (4) \$576,381 for connection of remote magistrate offices to court  
20 information system;  
21 (5) \$1,418,962 for the district attorney and public defender case  
22 management system expansion;  
23 (6) \$375,047 for the court information system for additional support  
24 personnel;

- 1           (7)   \$513,923 for court-ordered arbitration;  
2           (8)   \$303,756 for custody mediation;  
3           (9)   \$392,440 for Juvenile Services Division Intensive Counseling  
4                 positions;  
5           (10) \$118,296 for Juvenile Services Division Juvenile Transportation  
6                 Program; and  
7           (11) \$17,120 for additional prosecutorial staff for the new District  
8                 Attorney's office in Prosecutorial District 19-C.  
9         Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1994.
