The General As	sembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. G.S. 115C-81 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:	
"( <u>h) Instru</u>	action in American Values:
<u>(1)</u>	In public schools, special emphasis shall be given to instruction in
	obedience to the law; respect for the law; respect for the property of
	others; nonviolent behavior; honesty; morality; tolerance; respect for
	parents and the home; respect for teachers, law enforcement personnel,
	and adults; the dignity and necessity of honest labor; the concept of
	right and wrong; respect for self; respect for all humans, regardless of
	race, color, creed, national origin, religion, age, sex, or handicap;
	acknowledgement of the dignity and worth of individuals; the concept
	of responsibility; and other lessons that tend to promote and develop
	an upright and desirable citizenry.
<u>(2)</u>	The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall prepare an outline with
	suggestions that will best accomplish the purpose of this subsection,
	and the State Board of Education shall incorporate the outline in the
	courses of study for all public schools."
