



1           Sec. 6. Mr. Dan Ford of Wake County is appointed to the North Carolina  
2 Home Inspector Licensure Board for a term expiring June 30, 1998.

3           Sec. 7. Mr. Joseph Meacci of Moore County is appointed to the Board of  
4 Trustees of the Teachers' and State Employees' Comprehensive Major Medical Plan for a  
5 term expiring June 30, 1998.

6           Sec. 8. Ms. Suzanne Freeman of Mecklenburg County and Ms. Polly Godwin  
7 of Wake County are appointed to the North Carolina Center for Nursing Board of  
8 Directors for terms expiring June 30, 1999.

9           Sec. 9. Dr. G. Robert Horton of Moore County and Ms. Drane McCall of  
10 Forsyth County are appointed to the North Carolina Parks & Recreation Authority for  
11 terms expiring June 30, 1998.

12          Sec. 10. Mr. Patrick Joyce of Carteret County is appointed to the North  
13 Carolina Ports Authority for a term expiring June 30, 1998.

14          Sec. 11. Mr. Tobin Henry of Mecklenburg County is appointed to the Private  
15 Protective Services Board for a term expiring June 30, 1999.

16          Sec. 12. Mr. Tom Keith of Cumberland County is appointed to the North  
17 Carolina Real Estate Appraisal Board for a term expiring June 30, 1997.

18          Sec. 13. Mr. Paul Powell of Wake County is appointed to the Rules Review  
19 Commission for a term expiring June 30, 1998.

20          Sec. 14. Mr. Graham Cawthorne, Jr. (Public, nonsoils) of Wake County is  
21 appointed to the North Carolina Board for Licensing of Soil Scientists for a term expiring  
22 June 30, 1999.

23          Sec. 15. Ms. Jeannie Metcalf of Forsyth County is appointed to the North  
24 Carolina Teaching Fellows Commission for a term expiring June 30, 2000.

25          Sec. 16. G.S. 93E-1-5(a) reads as rewritten:

26          "(a) There is created the North Carolina Appraisal Board for the purposes set forth  
27 in this Chapter. The Board shall consist of seven members. The Governor shall appoint  
28 five members of the Board, and the General Assembly shall appoint two members in  
29 accordance with G.S. 120-121, one upon the recommendation of the President Pro  
30 Tempore of the Senate and one upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of  
31 Representatives. Each member appointed by the Governor shall be appointed from a  
32 different congressional district. The appointee recommended by the Speaker of the House  
33 of Representatives and the appointees of the Governor shall be persons who have been  
34 engaged in the business of real estate appraising in this State for at least five years  
35 immediately preceding their appointment and are also State-licensed or State-certified  
36 real estate appraisers. No more than ~~three~~four of the appointees may be members of the  
37 same appraiser trade organization, group, or committee at any one time. The appointee  
38 recommended by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall be a person not involved  
39 directly or indirectly in the real estate, real estate appraisal, or the real estate lending  
40 industry. Members of the Board shall serve three-year terms, so staggered that the terms  
41 of three members expire in one year, the terms of two members expire in the next year,  
42 and the terms of two members expire in the third year of each three-year period. The  
43 members of the Board shall elect one of their members to serve as chairman of the Board

1 for a term of one year. The Governor may remove any member of the Board appointed by  
2 the Governor for misconduct, incompetency, or neglect of duty. The General Assembly  
3 may remove any member appointed by it for the same reasons. Successors shall be  
4 appointed by the appointing authority making the original appointment. All vacancies  
5 occurring on the Board shall be filled, for the unexpired term, by the appointing authority  
6 making the original appointment. Vacancies in appointments made by the General  
7 Assembly shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Initial terms of office  
8 commence July 1, 1994."

9           Sec. 17. Except as otherwise provided, all appointments made by this act are  
10 for terms commencing July 1, 1996.

11           Sec. 18. This act is effective upon ratification.
