2 AN ACT TO TRANSFER MOORE COUNTY TO JUDICIAL AND
3 PROSECUTORIAL DISTRICTS 19B.
4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5 Section 1. (a) G.S. 7A-41(a) reads as rewritten:
6 "(a) The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior
7 court districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of regular
8 resident superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of less than
9 a whole county, as set out in subsection (b) of this section:

19 (b) The superior court judgeship created in subsection (a) of this section shall be
 20 filled by the superior court judge from current District 20A who resides in Moore
 21 County. The term of that judge expires December 31, 2000. That judge's successor shall
 22 be elected in the 2000 general election.

23 (c) G.S. 7A-41(d)(39) reads as rewritten:
 24 "(39) In the nineteenth-B superior court district, Russell G. Walker, Jr., serves
 25 a term expiring December 31, 1990. No election shall be held in 1998
 26 for the full term of the seat now occupied by Russell G. Walker, Jr., and
 27 the holder of that seat shall serve until a successor is elected in 2000 and
 28 qualifies. The succeeding term shall begin January 1, 2001."

29 Sec. 2. (a) G.S. 7A-133 reads as rewritten:
 30 "**§ 7A-133. Numbers of judges by districts; numbers of magistrates and additional**
 31 **seats of court, by counties.**

32 Each district court district shall have the numbers of judges and each county within
 33 the district shall have the numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, as set forth
 34 in the following table:

29 (b) One of the district court judgeships created by subsection (a) of this section
 30 shall be filled by the district court judge from current District 20 who resides in Moore
 31 County. The term of that judge expires the first Monday in December of 1998. That
 32 judge's successor shall be elected in the 1998 general election. The other district court
 33 judgeship created by subsection (a) of this section shall be elected in the 1996 general
 34 election for a four-year term commencing the first Monday in December 1996.

35 (c) Section 200.6(d) of Chapter 321 of the 1993 Session Laws is amended in the
 36 column titled "Judges" for district 20 by deleting "~~6-7~~" and substituting "6". Section
 37 200.6(e) of Chapter 321 of the 1993 Session Laws is amended by deleting "20,".

38 Sec. 3. (a) G.S. 7A-60(a1) reads as rewritten:

12 (b) The three assistant district attorney positions created for District 19B shall be
13 filled by three assistant district attorneys currently serving Moore County in District 20.

14 Sec. 4. Sections 1, 2, and 3 of this act become effective October 1, 1995, or
15 the date upon which those sections are approved under section 5 of the Voting Rights Act
16 of 1965, whichever is later. The remainder of this act is effective upon ratification.
