A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO CHANGE THE MANNER OF ELECTION OF THE MARTIN  
2 COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION FROM NONPARTISAN ELECTION AT  
3 THE TIME OF THE PRIMARY TO NONPARTISAN ELECTION AT THE TIME  
4 OF THE GENERAL ELECTION.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Section 1. Section 1.1 of Chapter 549 of the Session Laws of 1987 reads as  
8 rewritten:

9 "Sec. 1.1. Beginning with the 1988 regularly scheduled election for county boards  
10 of education, the Martin County Board of Education shall be elected from the seven  
11 districts described in Section 4 of this act. Only voters who reside in a district may vote  
12 in the election for that district. ◆ Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 115C-37,  
13 beginning in 1996 the Martin County Board of Education shall be elected on a  
14 nonpartisan basis at the time set by G.S. 163-1 for the general election in each even-  
15 numbered year as terms expire. The election shall be conducted on a nonpartisan  
16 plurality basis, with the results determined in accordance with G.S. 163-292.  
17 Candidates shall file notices of candidacy not earlier than noon on the first Monday in  
18 June and not later than noon on the last Friday in July. The names of the candidates  
19 shall be printed on the ballot without reference to any party affiliations. Except as  
20 provided by this act, the election shall be conducted in accordance with the applicable  
21 provisions of Chapters 115C and 163 of the General Statutes. "

1           Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
