9	certification of a facility which creates substantial risk that death or

11	occurred. Type A Violations shall be abated or eliminated immediately.
12	The Department shall impose a civil penalty in an amount not less than
13	two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) nor more than five thousand dollars
14	(\$5000) one thousand dollars (\$1,000) nor more than ten thousand
15	dollars (\$10,000) for each Type A Violation."
