18 19 Section 1. G.S. 130A-124 reads as rewritten:

"§ 130A-124. Department to establish maternal and child health program.

- (a) The Department shall establish and administer a maternal and child health program for the delivery of preventive, diagnostic, therapeutic and habilitative health services to women of childbearing years, children and other persons who require these services. The program may-shall include, but shall not be limited to, providing professional education and consultation, community coordination and direct care and <a href="counseling.co
- (a1) The Department shall develop and establish written policies supporting breast-feeding practices for the public sector workplace which address the following:
 - (1) Work schedule flexibility, including scheduling of breaks and work patterns to allow time for milk expression; and
 - (2) Provision of accessible locations that permit privacy and allow access to a nearby clean, safe water source and sink for washing hands and breast-pumping equipment.

G.S. 130A-361(a) reads as rewritten: "(a) The Department shall establish and administer a nutrition program to promote the public health by achieving and maintaining optimal nutritional status in the population through activities such as nutrition screening and assessment; dietary counseling and treatment; nutrition education; follow-up; referral; development and distribution of education materials supporting the initiation and duration of breast feeding; and the direct provision of food. The program may also include, but shall not be limited to, establishing policies and standards for nutritional practices; monitoring and surveillance of nutritional status; promoting interagency cooperation, professional education and consultation; providing technical assistance; conducting and supporting
