The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 11-7.1 reads as rewritten: "§ 11-7.1. Who may administer oaths of office. Except as otherwise specifically required by statute, an oath of office may be (a) administered by: A justice, judge, magistrate, clerk, assistant clerk, or deputy clerk of the (1) General Court of Justice, a retired justice or judge of the General Court of Justice, or any member of the federal judiciary; The Secretary of State; (2) A notary public; (3) **(4)** A register of deeds: A mayor of any city, town, or incorporated village; (5) A chairman of the board of commissioners of any county; (5a) The chairman of a committee A member of the House of (6) Representatives or Senate of the General Assembly, or either of the cochairmen of a joint committee; Assembly;
