4	ESTABLISH A FEE SCHEDULE FOR THE STATE WATER TESTING
5	SERVICES, AND TO PROVIDE THAT NO STATE RULE REGULATING
6	DRINKING WATER STANDARDS AND TESTING MAY BE MORE
7	RESTRICTIVE THAN THE FEDERAL LAW.
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	Section 1. G.S. 130A-88 reads as rewritten:
10	"(a) A State Laboratory of Public Health is established within the Department. The
11	State Laboratory of Public Health shall provide water testing services at a reasonable cost
12	to any person required to test drinking water supplies for contaminants under the federal
13	Safe Drinking Water Act. The Department is authorized to make examinations, and
14	provide consultation and technical assistance as the public health may require.
15	(a1) The fees to be charged by the State Laboratory of Public Health for water
16	testing services shall be determined by the General Assembly.
17	(b) The Commission shall adopt rules necessary for the operation of the State
18	Laboratory of Public Health."

"(c) The drinking water rules may be amended as necessary in accordance with 1 In adopting rules and management practices, the 2 required federal regulations. Commission shall be guided by the same considerations and criteria set forth, from time 3 to time, in federal law for the guidance of federal agencies administering the federal Safe 4 Drinking Water Act. The drinking water standards, limitations, and drinking water 5 testing requirements adopted under this Article shall be no more restrictive than the most 6 nearly applicable federal standard, limitation, or testing requirement." 7 Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification. 8
