4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
5	Section 1. The following monthly salary ranges apply to public school assistant	
6	superintendents, directors, supervisors, and finance officers for the 1995-96 fiscal year:

The local board of education shall determine the appropriate category and placement for each assistant superintendent, director, supervisor, or finance officer, within the salary ranges and within funds appropriated by the General Assembly for central office administrators and superintendents. The category in which an employee is placed shall be included in the contract of any employee hired after July 1, 1995.

- Sec. 2. The following monthly salary ranges apply to public school superintendents for the 1995-96 fiscal year:(1) Superintendent I (Up to 2,500 ADM): \$3,852 \$6,199
 - (2) Superintendent II (2,501 5,000 ADM): \$4,088 \$6,578
 - (3) Superintendent III (5,001 10,000 ADM): \$4,338 \$6,981
 - (4) Superintendent IV (10,001 25,000 ADM): \$4,604 \$7,408
- (5) Superintendent V (Over 25,000 ADM): \$4,886 \$7,861The local board of education shall determine the appropriate category and placement for the superintendent based on the average daily membership of the local school administrative unit and within funds appropriated by the General Assembly for central officer administrators and superintendents.
- Sec. 3. Longevity pay for superintendents, assistant superintendents, directors, supervisors, and finance officers shall be as provided for State employees.
- Sec. 4. The State Board of Education shall adopt a new funding allotment category for public school central office administrators. Funds allocated in that category to a local school administrative unit shall not exceed the funds appropriated for that purpose by the General Assembly. The State Board shall not permit local school administrative units to transfer funds from other funding categories to the new category for public school central office administrators.
- Sec. 5. This act shall not be construed to obligate the General Assembly to appropriate funds for the implementation of the salary ranges set out in this act.
 - Sec. 6. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995.
