2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A RESIDENTIAL EDUCATION CENTER FOR
3	DISRUPTIVE YOUTH WHO ARE AT RISK OF ENTERING THE JUVENILE
4	JUSTICE SYSTEM, AND TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
7	Article to read:
8	" <u>ARTICLE 9B.</u>
9	"DISRUPTIVE YOUTH RESIDENTIAL EDUCATION CENTER.
10	"§ 115C-150.5. Plan; administration; rules.
11	The Department of Human Resources, in collaboration with the State Board of
12	Education, shall develop a plan for the establishment of a residential center for disruptive
13	youth ages 13 to 18 who have been adjudicated delinquent or who are at high risk of
14	entering the juvenile justice system. These youth are not 'children with special needs'
15	within the meaning of G.S. 115C-109 unless they meet that definition because of some
16	other condition. For budgetary purposes, the center shall be located administratively in
17	the Division of Youth Services of the Department of Human Resources. The State Board
18	of Education shall adopt rules to administer this Article and shall provide technical
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19	assistance to the Department of Human Resources at that Department's request.

1	The superintendent of a local school administrative unit, or the superintendent's
2	representative, may refer to the Department of Human Resources for admission into the
3	residential center students who:
4	(1) Are 13 to 18 years old;
5	(2) Have a history of disruptive behavior; and
6	(3) Have been adjudicated delinquent or undisciplined or who are at high
7	risk of entering the juvenile justice system.
8	These students may include students who have been suspended or expelled from
9	school. No student shall be accepted for admission unless the parents or legal guardians
10	are involved in the referral and consent in writing to the admission. All students who are
11	admitted to the center will be held to the highest standards of behavior and self-discipline
12	while participating in a tightly structured, rigorous, and regimented education, work and
13	rehabilitation program.
14	" <u>§ 115C-150.7. Purpose.</u>
15	The emphasis of the residential center shall be discipline, education in the core
16	academic areas, and work in order to prepare participants to take positive control of their
17	lives and to become productive members of the community. The purpose of the center
18	shall be to:
19 20	 (1) <u>Hold participants responsible for personal behavior;</u> (2) Propero participants to live honest productive and responsible lives;
20 21	 (2) Prepare participants to live honest, productive, and responsible lives; (3) Prepare participants to finish high school, obtain a GED, or complete
21	vocational training;
22	(4) Prevent alcohol and substance abuse;
23 24	(5) Develop participants' self-discipline and pride; and
25	(6) Teach participants positive leadership and teamwork skills."
26	Sec. 2. The Division of Youth Services, Department of Human Resources, in
27	collaboration with the State Board of Education, shall develop plans for implementation
28	of this act, including construction of a facility and site selection, preferably utilizing land
29	donated to the State.
30	Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
31	Human Resources the sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for the 1995-96
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	fiscal year for the purpose of program and facility planning, site selection, and site
33	preparation for the residential center, and the sum of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for
