SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 1102

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THE MEMORY OF AMY JEAN JACKSON
2 AND COMMENDING THE HEROISM OF ROBERT G. JACKSON, JR.

3 Whereas, on July 7, 1995, Amy Jean Jackson, age 11, and Robert "Bobby" G.
4 Jackson, Jr., age 13, the children of Robert G. Jackson, Sr. and Shana Myatt Jackson,
5 became the victims of violent crimes committed against them on a farm in rural Caswell
6 County; and

7 Whereas, Amy Jean Jackson lost her life and her younger brother, who
8 exhibited great courage and valor in the aid of his sister, sustained grave injuries; and

9 Whereas, this tragic event is but one example of the many violent crimes
10 committed against the citizens of North Carolina; and

11 Whereas, Amy Jean Jackson will be remembered as an outgoing, bright,
12 friendly, athletic girl, who was very supportive of her brother; and

13 Whereas, Bobby Jackson deserves special recognition for his heroism during
14 such a terrible incident;

15 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring:

16 Section 1. The General Assembly mourns the loss of Amy Jean Jackson and
17 extends its sympathy to her family and friends and further commends the heroism of
18 Bobby Jackson.

19 Sec. 2. The Secretary of State shall transmit a certified copy of this resolution
20 to the family of Amy Jean Jackson.

21 Sec. 3. This resolution is effective upon ratification.
