6	Section 1. G.S. 15A-1343 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:	
7	"(b2) Special Conditions of Probation for Sex Offenders As special conditions of	
8	probation, a de	fendant who has been convicted of an offense which is a reportable
9	conviction as defined in G.S. 14-208.6(4), or which involves the physical, mental, or	
10	sexual abuse of	<u>a minor, must:</u>
11	<u>(1)</u>	Register as required by G.S. 14-208.7 if the offense is a reportable
12		conviction as defined by G.S. 14-208.6(4).
13	<u>(2)</u>	Participate in such evaluation and treatment as is necessary to complete
14		a prescribed course of psychiatric, psychological, or other rehabilitative
15		treatment as ordered by the court.
16	<u>(3)</u>	Not communicate with, be in the presence of, or found in or on the
17		premises of the victim of the offense.
18	<u>(4)</u>	Not reside in a household with any minor child if the offense is one in
19		which there is evidence of sexual abuse of a minor.

1	<u>(5)</u>	Not reside in a household with any minor child if the offense is one in
2		which there is evidence of physical or mental abuse of a minor, unless
3		the court expressly finds that it is unlikely that the defendant's harmful
4		or abusive conduct will recur and that it would be in the minor child's
5		best interest to allow the probationer to reside in the same household
6		with a minor child.
7	<u>(6)</u>	Satisfy any other conditions determined by the court to be reasonably
8		related to his rehabilitation.
9	Defendants	subject to the provisions of this subsection shall not be placed on
10	unsupervised pr	obation."
