A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR CONTINUED RESEARCH BY THE
INSTITUTE FOR THE STUDY OF MINORITY ISSUES AT NORTH CAROLINA
CENTRAL UNIVERSITY.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of
Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of one hundred fifty thousand
dollars (\$150,000) for the 1996-97 fiscal year for North Carolina Central University's
Institute for the Study of Minority Issues to continue its research pertaining to social and
economic issues, health, educational, psychological, technological, and environmental
policies affecting minorities. The Institute will use this money to:

- (1) Maintain a clearinghouse for demographic materials, working papers,
articles, and curriculum guides;
- (2) Disseminate research data and publish reports to public and private
institutions, agencies, schools, and community organizations;
- (3) Facilitate forums to discuss issues related to minorities in the New
South, e.g., diversity, race relations, multiculturalism, and alternative
schools; and
- (4) Identify and develop models, techniques, and approaches that are
relevant to community development in urban neighborhoods.

1 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1996.
