A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO EXEMPT FROM THE HIGHWAY USE TAX FIRE FIGHTING 3 VEHICLES OWNED BY ALL-VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 Section 1. G.S. 105-187.6(a) reads as rewritten: Full Exemptions. – The tax imposed by this Article does not apply when a 6 certificate of title is issued as the result of a transfer of a motor vehicle: 7 To the insurer of the motor vehicle under G.S. 20-109.1 because the 8 (1) 9 vehicle is a salvage vehicle. To either a manufacturer, as defined in G.S. 20-286, or a motor vehicle 10 (2) retailer for the purpose of resale. 11 To the same owner to reflect a change or correction in the owner's 12 (3) name. 13 By will or intestacy. 14 (4) By a gift between a husband and wife, a parent and child, or a 15 (5) stepparent and a stepchild. 16 By a distribution of marital property as a result of a divorce. 17 (6) To a handicapped person from the Department of Human Resources 18 **(7)** after the vehicle has been equipped by the Department for use by the 19

handicapped.
