BILL SUMMARY: "TO AMEND THE VITAL RECORDS LAW." Repeals G.S. 130A-26, which makes various violations of G.S. Chapter 130A, Art. 4 (vital records), general misdemeanors and replaces section with 130A-26A, which makes some violations Class 1 G.S. misdemeanors and others Class I felonies. Class 1 misdemeanors include those violations currently listed in G.S. paragraphs (6), (7), and (11); that part of paragraph (1) concerning false statements in a certificate; and new violation for charging a fee other than those set out in the law. Class I felonies include remaining paragraphs of G.S. 130A-26, except paragraph (9) and add violations for improperly manufacturing or possessing seal of Vital Records section, register of deeds, or county health department; for improperly preparing or issuing purported certified copy of vital record; and for improperly manufacturing or possessing vital record forms.
