BILL SUMMARY: TO CREATE A NEW OFFENSE OF THIRD DEGREE TRESPASS IN SURRY COUNTY. As title indicates, defines third degree trespass (Class 3 misdemeanor) as entering or remaining on premises of another for purpose of hunting, fishing, trapping, loitering, or operating all-terrain vehicle.
