FOR RESIDENTIAL REHABILITATIVE SERVICES TO MALE YOUTHS WHO
HAVE BEEN ENGAGED IN SERIOUS CRIMINAL ACTIVITY, MAJOR DRUG
ADDICTION, OR HIGHLY DESTRUCTIVE BEHAVIORS.

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16 17 Whereas, Making It UPSTREAM, Inc., (" UPSTREAM" ) is a nonprofit corporation located in Guilford County, with a mission that includes a successful nonresidential program for male youthful offenders referred by juvenile court counselors and alternative sentencing centers from across the State; and

Whereas, the program targets males between the ages of 14 to 17 who are in significant trouble with the law, illegal drugs, and other pathologies except mental illness; and

Whereas, UPSTREAM's mission also includes establishment of a residential program for the target population that uses the residential strategy to provide a comprehensive approach in which all aspects of living are subject to instruction and learning and where educational and interpersonal skills development may be addressed; and

Whereas, it is in the best interest of the State to support UPSTREAM in carrying out its expanded residential rehabilitative mission; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to Making It

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to Making It UPSTREAM, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, the sum of one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) for the 1997-98 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) for the 1998-99 fiscal year for operating expenses to carry out its mission to provide residential rehabilitative services for targeted male youthful offenders.

Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1997.

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
