5	The General Ass	embly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Sectio	n 1. The Legislative Research Commission may study the establishment
7	of a procedure v	whereby proposed or introduced bills that propose major changes to the
8	health care delive	very system in North Carolina may be reviewed by a committee or panel
9	of persons qualit	fied to evaluate the proposal and its impact on business, industry, and the
10	citizens of this	State. In conducting the study, the Commission may consider the
11	following:	
12	(1)	Whether the review should be conducted prior to further consideration
13		of the legislation by the General Assembly;
14	(2)	Whether bills proposing major changes to health care law should have
15		attached certification that the bill has been reviewed by the committee
16		or panel, including findings and recommendations of the committee or
17		panel; and
18	(3)	Any other matter that may assist in ensuring that legislation proposing
19		significant changes in the health care system receives the necessary

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1	legislative and professional review to facilitate well-informed decision
2	making by the General Assembly.
3	The Commission may make a preliminary report of its findings and
4	recommendations to the 1997 General Assembly, Regular Session 1998, and shall make
5	its final report to the 1999 General Assembly.
6	Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General
7	Assembly, the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 1997-98 fiscal year
8	and the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 1998-99 fiscal year to
9	conduct the study authorized under this act.
10	Section 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1997.
