## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- AN ACT TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE FOR SMALL, FAMILY-OWNED FARMS
  THROUGH GRANTS AND LOANS.
- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Legislative Findings. - The General Assembly recognizes the 5 economic and environmental advantages in maintaining and promoting small tracts of 6 land for agricultural production. Small-farm families are providing necessary food and 7 fiber for North Carolina citizens. Small farms provide beautiful land and open spaces for 8 the enjoyment of all North Carolina citizens. By using best management practices, 9 farmers of small, family-owned farms are actively working to protect the environment. 10 At the same time, they provide valuable products to our citizens and preserve a way of 11 life important to our cultural heritage. The Department of Agriculture and Consumer 12 Services should offer assistance for small, family-owned farms through grants and loans. 13 14 Section 2.
