1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE DEFINED CONTRIBUTION PENSION PLAN
3	STUDY COMMISSION.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. The Defined Contribution Pension Plan Study Commission is
6	created. The Commission shall consist of 17 voting members as follows:
7	(1) Five members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the
8	Speaker of the House of Representatives;
9	(2) Five members of the Senate to be appointed by the President Pro
10	Tempore of the Senate;
11	(3) The State Treasurer or the State Treasurer's designee;
12	(4) Two members, who are not employees of the State, one of whom is or
13	has been an executive officer of an insurance company, and one of
14	whom is a certified public accountant, to be appointed by the Speaker
15	of the House of Representatives;
16	(5) Two members, who are not employees of the State, one of whom is or
17	has been an executive officer of a bank doing business in this state,
18	and one of whom is a practicing actuary, to be appointed by the
19	President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
20	(6) Two members, one of whom is currently employed as a public school
21	teacher in the state, and one of whom is a state employee, to be
22	appointed by the Governor.
23	The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore
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24 of the Senate shall each designate a cochair from the General Assembly membership

serving on the Commission. The Commission shall meet upon the call of the cochairs. 1 2 A majority of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. 3 Section 2. The Commission shall examine the feasibility and desirability of 4 establishing a defined contribution pension plan to provide portable retirement benefits 5 for teachers and state employees. The Commission shall work cooperatively with the 6 Retirement System Division of the Department of State Treasurer to determine whether 7 a defined contribution plan should replace or be provided as an alternative to the 8 existing defined benefit plan for future employees. In the course of its study and in 9 making any recommendations, the Commission shall consider: 10 The costs and other fiscal implication for the state in creating a defined (a) contribution plan; 11 12 The costs and benefits to teachers and state employees, as compared to (b)13 the existing plan; 14 (c) How and by whom such a plan would be administered; 15 (d) The extent to which the current plan is contractually guaranteed and 16 the nature of any contract which might be created by a new plan. 17 Section 3. The Commission may contract for consultant services as provided 18 by G.S. 120-32.02. Upon approval of the Legislative Services Commission, the 19 Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional and clerical staff to assist in the 20 work of the Commission. Clerical staff shall be furnished to the Commission through 21 the offices of the House of Representatives and Senate Supervisors of Clerks. The 22 Commission may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building 23 upon the approval of the Legislative Services Commission. The Commission, while in 24 the discharge of official duties, may exercise all the powers provided under the provisions of G.S. 120-19 through G.S. 120-19.4, including the power to request all 25 officers, agents, agencies, and departments of the State to provide any information, data, 26 27 or documents within their possession, ascertainable from their records, or otherwise available to them, and the power to subpoena witnesses. 28 29 Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel 30 allowances as follows: 31 Commission members who are members of the General Assembly, at (1)32 the rate established in G.S. 120-3.1; Commission members who are officials or employees of the State or of 33 (2)34 local government agencies, at the rate established in G.S. 138-6; and 35 All other Commission members at the rate established in 138-5. (3)36 Section 4. There is appropriated the sum of fifty thousand dollar (\$50,000) for the 1998-1999 fiscal year to the Defined Contribution Pension Plan Study 37 38 Commission to complete the study authorized by this act. 39 Section 5. The Commission shall report the results of its study and its recommendations to the 1999 General Assembly. The Commission shall terminate 40 41 upon filing its report. 42 Section 6. This act is effective when it becomes law.
