HOUSE BILL 482

AN ACT TO ALLOW ALL HANDICAPPED PERSONS TO USE A REGISTERED
SIGNATURE FACSIMILE AS A MARK OF THEIR LEGAL SIGNATURE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 22A-1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 22A-1. Use of a signature facsimile by a ~~visually~~ handicapped person.

A ~~visually~~ handicapped person, as defined in ~~G.S. 111-11~~ G.S. 168A-3(4), may use a registered signature facsimile as a proper mark of ~~his~~ the person's legal signature. An example of the signature facsimile shall be registered by the ~~visually~~ handicapped person with the clerk of the superior court in the county ~~of his domicile, where the person lives.~~ The registered signature facsimile may be revoked at any time in writing by the ~~visually~~ handicapped person."

Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.

In the General Assembly read three times and ratified this the 9th day of June, 1997.
