S 1 SENATE BILL 110 Short Title: Establish Environmental Cabinet. (Public) Sponsors: Senators Perdue; and Odom. Referred to: Agriculture/Environment/National Resource. February 13, 1997 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO ESTABLISH AN ENVIRONMENTAL CABINET WITHIN THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Article 7 of Chapter 143B is amended by adding a new Part to read: "PART 4B. GOVERNOR'S ENVIRONMENTAL CABINET. "§ 143B-285.30. Environmental Cabinet created. Creation. – The Environmental Cabinet is created. The Environmental Cabinet shall be located administratively within, and shall exercise its powers within existing resources of, the Office of the Governor. However, the Environmental Cabinet shall exercise its statutory powers independently of the Office of the Governor. Membership; Meetings. - The Environmental Cabinet shall consist of the Governor, who shall serve as Chair, the Secretary of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources, and the Chairs of each of the following Commissions: The Coastal Resources Commission, the Environmental Management Commission, and the Marine Fisheries Commission. The Environmental Cabinet shall invite representatives of the business community, environmentalists, agriculture, marine fisheries, and others to participate in

its deliberations. The Environmental Cabinet shall meet at least quarterly.
