2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH AN ENVIRONMENTAL CABINET WITHIN THE OFFICE
3	OF THE GOVERNOR.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Article 7 of Chapter 143B is amended by adding a new Part to read:
6	" <u>PART 4C. GOVERNOR'S ENVIRONMENTAL CABINET.</u>
7	" <u>§ 143B-285.30. Environmental Cabinet created.</u>
8	(a) <u>Creation. – The Environmental Cabinet is created</u> . The Environmental Cabinet
9	shall be located administratively within, and shall exercise its powers within existing
10	resources of, the Office of the Governor. However, the Environmental Cabinet shall
11	exercise its statutory powers independently of the Office of the Governor.
12	(b) Membership; Meetings The Environmental Cabinet shall consist of the
13	Governor, who shall serve as Chair, the Secretary of Environment, Health, and Natural
14	Resources, and the Chairs of each of the following Commissions: The Coastal Resources
15	Commission, the Environmental Management Commission, and the Marine Fisheries
16	Commission. The Environmental Cabinet shall invite representatives of the business
17	community, environmentalists, agriculture, marine fisheries, and others to participate in
18	its deliberations. The Environmental Cabinet shall meet at least quarterly.

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1	<u>(c)</u>	Dutie	s. – The Environmental Cabinet shall be a nonvoting body that develops	
2	and recommends action to take a comprehensive view of protecting the environment,			
3	including:			
4		<u>(1)</u>	Enhancing communication and cooperation among and between the	
5			Coastal Resources Commission, the Environnmental Management	
6			Commission, the Marine Fisheries Commission, and their respective	
7			divisions in the Department.	
8		<u>(2)</u>	Informing the three Commissions of rules adopted and other action	
9			taken by each Commission to ensure consistency among the	
10			Commissions.	
11		<u>(3)</u>	Coordinating rule making and other responsibilities to make the	
12			Department more efficient with respect to overlapping responsibilities	
13			including, but not limited to, water quality, habitat protection, and	
14			permit issuance.	
15		<u>(4)</u>	Studying the consolidation of commissions.	
16		<u>(5)</u>	Establishing a strategy to develop teamwork within the Department to	
17			better manage the environment by reducing duplication in agency	
18			responsibilities and by simplifying the permitting process.	
19		<u>(6)</u>	Studying other issues referred to it by the Governor or the General	
20			Assembly.	
21	<u>(d)</u>		- The Office of the Governor, in coordination with the existing staff of	
22	the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources, shall provide staff to the			
23	Environr			
24	<u>(e)</u>	-	rting. – The Environmental Cabinet shall report semiannually beginning	
25	September 1 of each year to the Environmental Review Commission and the Joint			
26	Legislative Commission on Seafood and Aquaculture on the duties set forth in this			
27	section."			
28	Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1997. The Environmental			
29	Cabinet shall make its first report on or before September 1, 1997.
