A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR AN ADDITIONAL MAGISTRATE IN CURRITUCK COUNTY.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of thirty-four thousand two hundred eighty-eight dollars (\$34,288) for the 1998-99 fiscal year to provide for an additional magistrate in Currituck County.

Section 2. G.S. 7A-133(c) reads as rewritten:

"(c) Each county shall have the numbers of magistrates and additional seats of district court, as set forth in the following table:
