1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO LINK PAY RAISES FOR SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS TO PAY RAISES
3	FOR TEACHERS.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 115C-12(8) reads as rewritten:
6	"(8) Power to Make Provisions for Sick Leave and for Substitute Teachers. –
7	The Board shall provide for sick leave with pay for all public school
8	employees in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter and shall
9	promulgate rules and regulations providing for necessary substitutes on
10	account of sick leave and other teacher absences.
11	The pay for a substitute shall be fixed by the Board.—The minimum pay
12	for a substitute teacher who holds a teaching certificate shall be paid at
13	seventy-five percent (75%) of the daily pay rate of an entry-level
14	teacher with an 'A' certificate. The minimum pay for a substitute
15	teacher who does not hold a teaching certificate shall be paid at sixty
16	percent (60%) of the daily pay rate of an entry-level teacher with an 'A'
17	certificate.
18	Local boards may use State funds allocated for substitute teachers to
19	hire full-time substitute teachers.

If a teacher assistant acts as a substitute teacher, the salary of the 1 teacher assistant for the day shall be the same as the daily salary of an 2 3 entry-level teacher with an 'A' certificate. 4 The Board may provide to each local school administrative unit not exceeding one percent (1%) of the cost of instructional services for the 5 6 purpose of providing substitute teachers for those on sick leave as 7 authorized by law or by regulations of the Board, but not exceeding the provisions made for other State employees." 8 Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to State Aid to Local 9 10

Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to State Aid to Local School Administrative Units the sum of fifteen million seven hundred seventy-six thousand two hundred eighty dollars (\$15,776,280) for the 1998-99 fiscal year to implement Section 1 of this act.

Section 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1998.
