A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2

AN ACT TO ALLOW AN INCREASED PENALTY FOR SPEEDING IN A HIGHWAY WORK ZONE OF UP TO TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. G.S. 20-141(j2) reads as rewritten:

- "(j2) A person who drives a motor vehicle in a highway work zone at a speed greater than the speed limit set and posted under G.S. 20-141 is responsible for an infraction of 'Speeding in a Highway Work Zone' and is-shall be required to pay a penalty of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00). (\$100.00), but not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00). A 'highway work zone' is the area between the first sign that informs motorists of the existence of a work zone on a highway and the last sign that informs motorists of the end of the work zone. This subsection applies only if a sign posted at the
- beginning of the highway work zone states the penalty for speeding in the work zone. 13
- The Secretary shall ensure that work zones shall only be posted with penalty signs if the 14
- Secretary determines, after engineering review, that the posting is necessary to ensure the 15
- safety of the traveling public due to a hazardous condition." 16

Section 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1997, and applies to violations which occur on or after that date.
