The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Chapter 18B of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 18B-1009. In-stand sales. Nothing in this Chapter shall be construed to prohibit a retail permittee from selling for consumption, malt beverages in the seating areas of stadiums, ballparks, and other similar public places with a seating capacity of 60,000 or more during professional sporting events, in municipalities with a population greater than 450,000, provided that: The seating areas are designated as part of the retail permittee's licensed (1) premises: The retail permittee has notified the Commission, in writing, of its (2) intent to sell malt beverages in the seating areas at sporting events: Service of food and nonalcoholic beverages is available in the seating (3) areas; and The retail permittee has trained its employees: (4) To identify underage persons and intoxicated persons; and a.
