2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO ENHANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
3	IN WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA THROUGH THE SMALL TOWN
4	REVITALIZATION AND COUNTY PLANNING PROGRAM.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
7	Commerce the sum of three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) for the 1999-2000
8	fiscal year to enhance economic development in Western North Carolina through the
9	Small Town Revitalization and County Planning Program. The Department shall
10	establish and implement this program to encourage small municipalities and county
11	governments to work locally with small business, industry, tourism, and other community
12	organizations to develop collaborative programs focusing on strategies that will lead to
13	the revitalization of downtown areas and efforts by counties to assess and plan for
14	infrastructure and growth needs into and beyond the year 2000.
15	Section 2. Not less than fifteen percent (15%) of the total funds for the
16	program shall be used for small towns.
17	Section 3. The Department shall develop procedures for the administration and
18	distribution of funds allocated to the Small Town Revitalization and County Planning

19 Program under the following guidelines:

2	(2)	Priority shall be given to small municipalities needing assistance with
