2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE BONUSES UNDER THE ABCs OF EDUCATION
3	PROGRAM TO NONCERTIFIED PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 115C-105.36(a) reads as rewritten:
6	"(a) The personnel in schools that achieve a level of expected growth greater than
7	one hundred percent (100%) at a level to be determined by the State Board of Education
8	are eligible for financial awards in amounts set by the State Board. General Assembly.
9	Schools and personnel shall not be required to apply for these awards. For the purpose of
10	this section, "personnel" includes the principal, assistant principal, instructional personnel,
11	instructional support personnel, and teacher assistants-teacher assistants, and other
12	noncertified personnel (i) serving students in one or more of the grades kindergarten
13	through 12 or (ii) assigned to a public school prekindergarten program that is located
14	within a public elementary school and is designed to prepare students for kindergarten at
15	that school."
16	Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to State Aid to Local
17	School Administrative Units the sum of ten million five hundred seventy-five thousand
18	six hundred twenty-seven dollars (\$10,575,627) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year and the

1 (\$10,575,627) for the 2000-2001 fiscal year to provide for financial awards to 2 noncertified personnel, other than teacher assistants, under the ABCs of Education 3 Program. The State Board of Education shall allocate these funds to local school 4 administrative units at the amounts per qualifying employee as it does for teacher 5 assistants. The local board of education shall determine the amount of these funds each 6 qualifying employee shall receive.

7 Section 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999. Section 1 of this act 8 applies to school years beginning with the 1999-2000 school year.
