A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO LIMIT DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION CONTAINED
2 IN APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSES ISSUED BY THE PRIVATE PROTECTIVE
3 SERVICES BOARD AND THE ALARM SYSTEMS LICENSING BOARD AND
4 TO AUTHORIZE THE ALARM SYSTEMS LICENSING BOARD TO ISSUE AN
5 APPRENTICESHIP REGISTRATION PERMIT.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 Section 1. G.S. 74C-8 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

9 "(g) Except for purposes of administering the provisions of this section and for law
10 enforcement purposes, the Board shall not disclose the home address or telephone
11 number of an applicant, licensee, or the spouse, children, or parents of an applicant or
12 licensee unless the applicant or licensee consents to such disclosure. The provisions of
13 this subsection shall not apply when a licensee's home address or telephone number is
14 also his or her business address and telephone number."

15 Section 2. G.S. 74D-2 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

16 "(f) Except for purposes of administering the provisions of this section and for law
17 enforcement purposes, the Board shall not disclose the home address or telephone
18 number of an applicant, licensee, or the spouse, children, or parents of an applicant or
19 licensee unless the applicant or licensee consents to such disclosure. The provisions of

1 this subsection shall not apply when a licensee's home address or telephone number is
2 also his or her business address and telephone number."

3 Section 3. Chapter 74D of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
4 section to read:

5 **"§ 74D-8.1. Apprenticeship registration permit.**

6 (a) The Board may issue an apprenticeship registration permit to an applicant who
7 is 16 or 17 years old if the applicant holds a valid drivers license and submits at least
8 three letters of recommendation stating that the applicant is of good moral character as
9 provided in G.S. 74D-2(d)(2). The letters of recommendation shall be from persons who
10 are not related to the individual and at least one of the letters shall be from an official at
11 the school where the applicant is currently enrolled.

12 (b) There shall be no fee for an apprenticeship registration permit, and the permit
13 shall expire when the holder attains the age of 18 years old. The denial, suspension, or
14 revocation of an apprenticeship registration permit shall be in accordance with the
15 provisions of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes.

16 (c) The applicant shall not perform services as authorized under this Chapter until
17 after the Board has reviewed his or her application and issued him or her an
18 apprenticeship registration permit. The holder of an apprenticeship registration permit
19 shall be accompanied by a licensee or registered employee while engaged in activities
20 authorized under this Chapter."

21 Section 4. This act becomes effective on September 1, 1999.
