A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE TRACING OF FIREARMS USED IN THE
COMMISSION OF A CRIME.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 114-10 reads as rewritten:

"§ 114-10. Division of Criminal Statistics.

The Attorney General shall set up in the Department of Justice a division to be designated as the Division of Criminal Statistics. There shall be assigned to this Division by the Attorney General duties as follows:

- (1) To collect and correlate information in criminal law administration, including crimes committed, arrests made, dispositions on preliminary hearings, prosecutions, convictions, acquittals, punishment, appeals, together with the age, race, and sex of the offender, the necessary data to make a trace regarding all firearms seized, forfeited, found, or otherwise coming into the possession of any State or local law enforcement agency of the State that are believed to have been used in the commission of a crime, and such other information concerning crime and criminals as may appear significant or helpful. To correlate such information with the operations of agencies and institutions

1 charged with the supervision of offenders on probation, in penal and
2 correctional institutions, on parole and pardon, so as to show the
3 volume, variety and tendencies of crime and criminals and the workings
4 of successive links in the machinery set up for the administration of the
5 criminal law in connection with the arrests, trial, punishment, probation,
6 prison parole and pardon of all criminals in North Carolina.

7 (2) To collect, correlate, and maintain access to information that will assist
8 in the performance of duties required in the administration of criminal
9 justice throughout the State. This information may include, but is not
10 limited to, motor vehicle registration, drivers' licenses, wanted and
11 missing persons, stolen property, warrants, stolen vehicles, firearms
12 registration, sexual offender registration as provided under Article 27A
13 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes, drugs, drug users and parole and
14 probation histories. In performing this function, the Division may
15 arrange to use information available in other agencies and units of State,
16 local and federal government, but shall provide security measures to
17 insure that such information shall be made available only to those whose
18 duties, relating to the administration of justice, require such information.

19 (3) To make scientific study, analysis and comparison from the information
20 so collected and correlated with similar information gathered by federal
21 agencies, and to provide the Governor and the General Assembly with
22 the information so collected biennially, or more often if required by the
23 Governor.

24 (4) To perform all the duties heretofore imposed by law upon the Attorney
25 General with respect to criminal statistics.

26 (5) To perform such other duties as may be from time to time prescribed by
27 the Attorney General.

28 (6) To promulgate rules and regulations for the administration of this
29 Article."

30 Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
