A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO DEVELOP A PROPOSAL FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCATE AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THAT PURPOSE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. The Office of the Governor shall develop a proposal for the establishment of the Office of Consumer Advocate ("Office") to protect the citizens of the State from deceptive and unfair practices of the insurance industry by providing consumers of insurance products and services with a fair, impartial, and effective advocate in judicial and administrative proceedings and with regard to proposed changes to insurance rates and coverage. In developing the proposal, the Office of the Governor shall review similar offices or divisions in other states. The proposal shall include recommendations regarding:

- (1) The organizational and administrative structure of the Office of Consumer Advocate;
- (2) The functions and duties of the State's consumer advocate. In developing the proposed functions and duties of the consumer advocate, the Office of the Governor shall consider authorizing the advocate to (i) initiate and appear in judicial and administrative proceedings on behalf of consumers of insurance services or products provided by any person

- or corporation licensed by the State, (ii) obtain discovery, present evidence, and advocate in matters or proceedings involving proposed changes in insurance rates, coverage amounts, or benefits, and inform the public of those changes, and (iii) educate and inform the public about services available to consumers of insurance products and services in the State:
- (3) The staffing of the Office, including a list of proposed personnel positions, the desired qualifications of personnel, and the proposed salaries of those positions;
- (4) The proposed budget for the Office, including the source of funds, any fee schedule that would be instituted by the Office, and the cost of contracting with actuarial consultants, accountants, investigators, and expert witnesses to fulfill the functions and duties of the Office;
- (5) Any reporting requirements of the Office; and
- (6) The date by which the Office is expected to be functioning effectively and efficiently.

Section 2. On or before April 1, 2000, the Governor shall report the proposal for establishment of the Office of Consumer Advocate, including any legislative proposals and funding requirements that are required to implement the purposes and functions of the Office, to the General Assembly.

Section 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of the Governor the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year to implement this act.

Section 4. Section 3 of this act becomes effective July 1, 1999. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
