A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE NORTH CAROLINA LEAD 3 REGIONAL ORGANIZATIONS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 6 Commerce the sum of one million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$1,800,000) for the 7 1999-2000 fiscal year and the sum of one million eight hundred thousand dollars 8 (\$1,800,000) for the 2000-2001 fiscal year for the Lead Regional Organizations.

9 Section 2. Each Lead Regional Organization is allocated up to the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for each fiscal year with the actual amount 10 calculated as provided herein. These funds shall be allocated as follows: A share of the 11 maximum one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal year shall be allocated to 12 each county and smaller city based on the most recent annual estimate of the Office of 13 State Planning of the population of that county (less the population of any larger city 14 within that county) or smaller city, divided by the sum of the total population of the 15 region (less the population of larger cities within that region) and the total population of 16 the region living in smaller cities. Those funds shall be paid to the Lead Regional 17 Organization for the region in which that city or county is located upon receipt by the 18 Department of Commerce of a resolution of the governing board of the county or city 19

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requesting release of the funds. If any city or county does not so request payments of 1 funds by June 30 of a State fiscal year, that share of the allocation for that fiscal year 2 3 shall revert to the General Fund. 4 Section 3. A Lead Regional Organization may use funds appropriated by this act only to assist local governments in grant applications, economic development, 5 6 community development, support of local industrial development activities, and other activities as deemed appropriate by the member governments. 7 8 Section 4. Funds appropriated by this act shall not be used for payment of dues

9 or assessments by the member governments and shall not supplant funds appropriated by
10 member governments.

11 Section 5. As used in this act, "Larger City" means an incorporated city with a 12 population of 50,000 or over. "Smaller City" means any other incorporated city.

13 Section 6. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
