**A BILL TO BE ENTITLED**

**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR METAL DETECTORS FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.**

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1.(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Instruction the sum of three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year to provide metal detectors for the public schools. Each local board of education may apply for either a portable walk-through model for the local school administrative unit or a hand-held model for each school in the local school administrative unit.

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1           Section 1.(b) In allocating these funds, the Superintendent of Public Instruction  
2 shall give highest priority to providing:

3           (1)    A portable walk-through model to each local school administrative unit  
4                    requesting one that does not have one, and

5           (2)    A hand-held model for each school for which one is requested and that  
6                    does not have one.

7           Section 1.(c)    The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall allocate any  
8 remaining funds on a pro rata basis to provide:

9           (1)    A portable walk-through model to each local school administrative unit  
10                    requesting one that already has one, and

11           (2)    A hand-held model for each school for which one is requested and that  
12                    already has one.

13           Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
