1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED						
2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO ESTABLISH A SALARY SCHEDULE FOR						
3	ASSISTANT TEACHERS.						
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:						
5	Section 1. G.S. 115C-12 reads as rewritten:						
6	"§ 115C-12. Powers and duties of the Board generally.						
7	The general supervision and administration of the free public school system shall be						
8	vested in the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall establish						
9	policy for the system of free public schools, subject to laws enacted by the General						
10	Assembly. The powers and duties of the State Board of Education are defined as follows:						
11	(16) Power with Regard to Salary Schedules. – The Board						
12	shall provide for sick leave with pay for all public school						
13	employees in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter and						
14	shall promulgate rules and regulations providing for necessary						
15	substitutes on account of sick leave and other teacher absences.						
16	a. Support personnel refers to all public school employees who are						
17	not required by statute or regulation to be certified in order to be						
18	employed. The State Board of Education is authorized and						
19	empowered to adopt all necessary rules for full implementation						

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37 38 of all schedules to the extent that State funds are made available for support personnel.

- b. Salary schedules for the following public school support personnel shall be adopted by the State Board of Education: school finance officer, office support personnel, teacher assistants, maintenance supervisors, custodial personnel, and transportation personnel. The Board shall classify these support positions in terms of uniform pay grades included in the salary schedule of the State Personnel Commission.
- 10 By the end of the third payroll period of the 1995-96 fiscal year, local-Local boards of education shall place State-allotted office 11 12 support personnel, teacher assistants, and custodial personnel on the salary schedule adopted by the State Board of Education so 13 14 that the average salary paid is the State-allotted amount for the 15 category. In placing employees on the salary schedule, the local board shall consider the education, training, and experience of 16 17 each employee, including experience in other local school 18 administrative units. It is the intent of the General Assembly that a local school administrative unit not fail to employ an employee 19 who was employed for the prior school year in order to 20 21 implement the provisions of this sub-subdivision. A local board of education is in compliance with this sub-subdivision if the 22 average salary paid is at least ninety-five percent (95%) of the 23 State-allotted amount for the category at the end of the third 24 payroll period of the 1995-96 fiscal year, and at least ninety-25 eight percent (98%) of the State-allotted amount for the category 26 27 at the end of the third payroll period of each subsequent fiscal year. The Department of Public Instruction shall provide 28 29 technical assistance to local school administrative units regarding 30 the implementation of this sub-subdivision.
 - Salary schedules for other support personnel, including but not c. limited to maintenance and school food service personnel, shall be adopted by the State Board of Education. The Board shall classify these support positions in terms of uniform pay grades included in the salary schedule of the State Personnel Commission. These schedules shall apply if the local board of education does not adopt a salary schedule of its own for personnel paid from other than State appropriations.
- 39" 40 Section 2. Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 41 section to read:
- "§ 115C-315.1. Teacher Assistant Professional Development Certificate Program. 42

1	(a) <u>Development of a Teacher Assistant Professional Development Certificate</u>							
2	Program The State Board of Community Colleges, subject to the direction, control, and							
3	approval of the State Board of Education, shall develop and administer a teacher assistant							
4	professional development certificate program. The program curriculum shall be							
5	appropriate to meet the requirements necessary for teacher assistants to contribute to							
6	student achievement. The certificate program shall include an associate degree certificate							
7	that prepares a teacher assistant to enter a teacher education program at a university.							
8	Community colleges are encouraged to offer courses in collaboration with local school							
9	administrative units, educational associations, the Teacher Academy Program, and other							
10	entities that provide in-service or preservice training to educators.							
11	(b) Development of a Portfolio Program to Enable Teacher Assistants to Earn							
12	Credit for Prior Learning Experience The State Board of Community Colleges, subject							
13	to the direction, control, and approval of the State Board of Education, shall develop and							
14	administer a portfolio program to assist teacher assistants with prior learning experience							
15	in developing portfolios of that experience which may be used to earn credit under the							
16	certificate program. Teacher assistants who participate in the portfolio program and							
17	develop portfolios may apply to community colleges for credit for their prior learning							
18	experience. A transcript or verification form signed by the representative of the college							
19	offering the course shall document participation in the portfolio program.							
20	Portfolios submitted to community colleges for credit shall be evaluated by an expert							
21	in education who holds a masters degree or higher degree.							
22	A teacher assistant shall complete a portfolio by 2004 in order to use prior learning							
23	experience as credit for a certificate. The State Board of Education may extend this date							
24	if the Community College System has not been able to accommodate eligible teacher							
25	assistants prior to January 1, 2004.							
26	(c) Credit for Courses Taken in Other States and for Courses Taken Prior to							
27	Establishment of the Program The State Board of Education and the State Board of							
28	Community Colleges shall, to the maximum extent possible, accept transcripts from							
29	colleges in any state as college credits if the courses taken meet curriculum guidelines							
30	and are related to the competencies necessary to be a teacher assistant.							
31	Continuing education or staff development courses taken between 1981 through 2000							
32	shall be eligible for credit under the certification program.							
33	(d) Establishment of a Professional Development Plan Certificate Committee. –							
34	The State Board of Community Colleges shall appoint a Professional Development Plan							
35	Certificate Committee to monitor the teacher assistant certificate programs and portfolio							
36	programs offered at the colleges and to make recommendations to the State Board of							
37	Community Colleges on ways to improve implementation of the programs to meet the							
38	needs of local school administrative units.							
39	The Committee shall be comprised of one elementary school principal, one							
40	community college director, one teacher, one university educator, a local school staff							
41	development specialist, and six teacher assistants.							
42	(e) Types of Teacher Assistant Certificates Offered The State Board of							
43	Education shall offer the following types of teacher assistant certificates:
