4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:					
5	Section 1. Part 1 of Article 6 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is					
6	amended by adding a new section to read:					
7	" <u>§ 130A-149. Community-based needle and syringe exchange programs.</u>					
8	(a) Notwithstanding Article 5B of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes, a program					
9	for a county designated under subsection (b) of this section to participate in a community-					
10	based needle and syringe exchange program may be approved by a local board of health					
11	if it satisfies all of the following conditions:					
12	(1) <u>A plan is submitted to the local board of health for review and approval</u>					
13	that includes each of the following components:					
14	<u>a.</u> <u>A description of program activities that includes, at a minimum,</u>					
15	all of the following:					
16	<u>1.</u> <u>The safe handling, exchange, and disposal of needles and</u>					
17	syringes.					
18	2. <u>The provision of HIV/STD risk reduction information to</u>					
19	participants, as well as information about tuberculosis and					
20	blood borne diseases such as hepatitis.

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1 Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 2 Health and Human Services the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1999-3 2000 fiscal year and the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 2000-2001 fiscal 4 year to implement and evaluate the needle and syringe exchange programs authorized by 5 Section 1 of this act.

6 Section 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
