5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
6	Section 1. G.S. 108A-70.18 reads as rewritten:		
7	"§ 108A-70.18. Definitions.		
8	Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the term:		
9	(1)	'Comprehensive health coverage' means creditable health coverage as	
10		defined under Title XXI.	
11	(2)	'Family income' has the same meaning as used in determining eligibility	
12		for the Medical Assistance Program.	
13	(3)	'FPL' or 'federal poverty level' means the federal poverty guidelines	
14		established by the United States Department of Health and Human	
15		Services, as revised each April 1.	
16	(4)	'Medical Assistance Program' means the State Medical Assistance	
17		Program established under Part 6 of Article 2 of Chapter 108A of the	
18		General Statutes.	

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1	(5)	'Program' means The Health Insurance Program for Children
2		established in this Part.
3	(6)	'State Plan' means the State Child Health Plan for the State Children's
4		Health Insurance Program established under Title XXI.
5	(7)	'Title XXI' means Title XXI of the Social Security Act, as added by
6		Pub. L. 105-33, 111 Stat. 552, codified in scattered sections of 42
7		U.S.C. (1997).
8	(8)	'Uninsured' means the applicant for Program benefits was not covered
9		under any private or employer-sponsored comprehensive health
10		insurance plan for the six-month period immediately preceding the date
11		of application for Program benefits. Effective April 1, 1999, 'uninsured'
12		means the applicant is and was not covered under any private or
13		employer-sponsored comprehensive health insurance plan for 60 days
14		immediately preceding is not covered under any private or employer-
15		sponsored comprehensive health insurance plan on the date of
16		application. The waiting periods required under this subdivision shall be
17		waived if the child has been enrolled in Medicaid and has lost Medicaid
18		eligibility, has lost health care benefits due to cessation of a nonprofit
19		organization program that provides health care benefits to low-income
20		children, or has lost employer-sponsored comprehensive health care
21		coverage due to termination of employment, cessation by the employer
22		of employer-sponsored health coverage, or cessation of the employer's
23		business."
